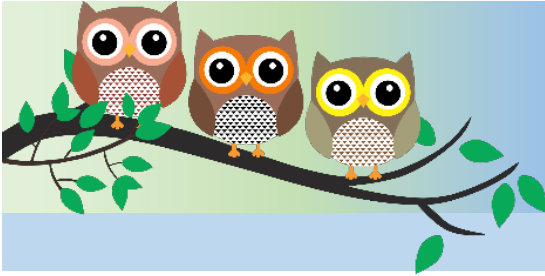

## Servants of Christ

***“Servants of Christ and Stewards of God’s Mysteries”***

*Think of us in this way, as servants of Christ and stewards of God’s mysteries. Moreover, it is required of stewards that they be found trustworthy. I Corinthians 4:1-2*

*Therefore, brothers and sisters, holy partners in a heavenly calling, consider that Jesus, the apostle, and high priest of our confession, was faithful to the one who appointed him, just as Moses also ‘was faithful in all God’s house. Hebrews 3:1-2  
NRSV*

We are fashioned in the image and likeness of God (Genesis 1:26), and appointed trustees of God’s mysteries as servants of Christ, “holy partners in a heavenly calling,” stewards of everything given into our care. From the beginning, made of the Wisdom that fashioned the cosmos-made of love and for love, made for communion, as “holy partners” with the divine and with fellow seekers on “the way,” and as, those called to a trustworthy and responsible stewardship. Christian stewardship is relational and accountable. Contained therein are the hopes and dreams God holds for human flourishing and for his kingdom come near. Gifts given for the blessing and common good of the cosmos and our neighbors. To be clear, we did not earn or deserve these gifts and we are not entitled to any ownership of these gifts-like this earth, the air we breathe, the water sustaining us, our family, friends and faith community and the unmerited favor of God the creator and giver of all our gifts. Indeed “all things come from God, and of God’s own have we given” (I Chronicles 14b)



Healthy stewardship pushes back against the tendency toward entitlement, privilege, and us and them sorting, and the unholy trinity of “I, my, and ours” as well as our feverish clinging to what is not ours but God’s. Seeing, in contrast, our God given blessings as a source of well-being for everyone and not just for ourselves-our blessings as something to be shared and not held for ourselves. Stewardship, in this way, is deeply rooted in God’s generosity revealed in creation and scripture and not merely as fund raising campaign to satisfy budgetary needs or a “economic strategy”, but as a call for each of us to be faithful in God’s house - called as “good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serving one another with whatever gift each of you has received (I Peter 4:10)”.

Stewardship, by its nature, is spiritual practice. It intentionally recognizes and celebrates the connection we have with each other by a life-giving presence greater than we are, and the connection we have with that presence and each other which is firmly planted in love, compassion and carefully nurtured in healthy families and faith communities.

It is an experience of living out deeply held relationships, values and honoring with our lives and resources a presence greater than ourselves. Put another way *"Nothing is more practical than finding God, than falling in love in a quite absolute, final way. What you are in love with, what seizes imagination, will affect everything. It will decide what will get you out of bed in the morning, what you will do with your evening, how you spend your weekends, what you read, whom you know, what breaks your heart, and what amazes you with joy and gratitude. Fall in love, stay in love, and it will decide everything."* (Fr. Pedro Arrupe, S. J.)

There is an old Hindu fable about a motherless tiger cub who, not long after it was abandoned, was adopted by a herd of goats. The baby tiger was welcomed into their family and brought up to speak their language, emulate their ways, eat their food, and in general believe he was a goat himself.

Then one day an adult tiger came along, and of course all the goats scattered, leaving the young cub alone to confront him. The tiger asked the cub what he meant by this ridiculous charade, but all the cub could do was bleat nervously and continue eating grass. So, the tiger carried him to a pool and forced him to look at their reflections side-by-side and draw his own conclusions.

When that failed, he offered the cub his first piece of raw meat. At first the cub recoiled at the unfamiliar taste of it, but gradually, as he ate more and felt it warming his blood, the truth finally became clear to him. After lashing his tail and digging his claws into the ground, the young tiger raised his head and let out a loud roar.

The point is this: we were created in the image of God, but we have been conditioned to believe less about ourselves. That we are only what others say we are, and no more. That the world and the people in it will inevitably chew us up and we are only what remains. But deep down, we were made for more. We eat grass, but it never really fills us. We bleat, but we were really made for roaring.

Many people enjoy discovering their lineage on ancestry.com. Today however, I challenge you to carry with you your divine ancestry...

- That you were made in the image of God Himself
- That you carry his divine imprint within you.
- That nothing can separate you from His love.
- That no weapon formed against you will stand.
- That you are not a victim, you are more than a conqueror.

Today you can refuse all the "less than" messages you have received... even if they are from someone you love. Remember today who you are, and Whose you are.

Recently during Monday Morning Prayer and Praise at Good Shepherd Hospice the Reverend Brad Tuggle, Chaplain shares this devotion from Frederick Buechner's Book "The Hungering Dark." It spoke to me, and I hope will encourage you as well.

Join us every Sunday following the service for coffee & fellowship.

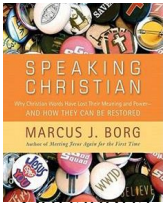

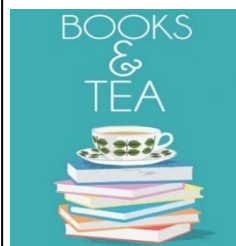
Recipients must be women who are members of an Episcopal parish in the Diocese of Kansas. Funding is for adult women that wish to continue their education experiences. Returning to College, Community Workshops, Seminar and Convocation Educational Events, Education for Ministry

(EFM), and the Bishop Kemper School for Ministry (BKSM) are all examples of approved continuing education opportunities.

One scholarship of up to \$100 a year will be awarded to an applicant who meets the criteria. Any one individual will be limited to receiving a maximum of \$300 during a 5-year period.

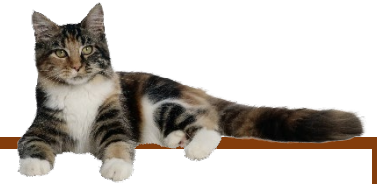

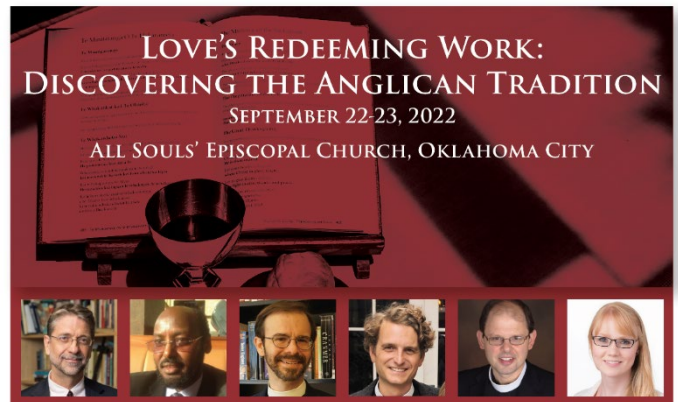
## ***Province VII Episcopal Church Women Fall Gathering***
